After graduating from the United States Military Academy at West Point, Mr. Cruden served in Airborne, Ranger, and Special Forces units in Germany and Vietnam. His subsequent military assignments include as a criminal prosecutor in Germany and civil trial lawyer in the Pentagon; Chief of Litigation Branch, Europe; General Counsel, Defense Nuclear Agency; Staff Judge Advocate in Germany; and Director of Administrative and Civil Law, Judge Advocate General's School, Charlottesville, VA. His military education includes being a Fellow, Army War College, and the Command and General Staff College.

Mr. Cruden's awards for government and military service include the *President Rank Award* from three different Presidents, the *Bronze Star*, *Legion of Merit*, *Defense Meritorious Service Medal*, *Air Medal with Oak Leaf Clusters*, and the *Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Silver Star*.
