The City of Grand Rapids Environmental Services Department will provide a unique opportunity to explore and learn about the city's national award-winning Water Resource Recovery Facility (WRRF).

The facility, which services 13 communities and treats \$40 million gallons of water a day, was constructed in 1931 and has been expanded over the years. In December 2017, the facility broke ground on a \$38 million waste-to-energy biodigester as part of the City's goal of using 100-percent renewable energy to power its buildings by 2025. This is a wonderful opportunity to learn more about the project, as well as other sustainability efforts of WRRF.
