Laurie Horridge NACWA Board Member Executive Director Narragansett Bay Commission Providence, RI

Laurie Horridge assumed the role of Executive Director of the Narragansett Bay Commission, Rhode Island's largest clean water agency, in 2019. As Executive Director, she leads a staff of 270 environmentalists to provide wastewater collection and treatment services to approximately 400,000

people in the Greater Providence and Blackstone Valley areas.

Ms. Horridge oversees a \$330M combined capital and operating annual budget to support Rhode Island's two largest wastewater treatment facilities. Under her leadership, the Narragansett Bay Commission was named a *Utility of the Future* for the second time and received its third *Excellence in Management Award* at the Platinum level. Since she assumed the Executive Directorship, the Narragansett Bay Commission (NBC) has received the largest Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act loan in Region I and two subsequent Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act designations. She has continued the Commission's leadership in renewable energy production by diversifying and enlarging the Commission's renewables portfolio to include additional solar, wind, and biogas facilities, ensuring that the Commission will reach its goal of providing 100% of energy demand through renewable sources. In her 30-year career at NBC, she served as General Counsel and Director of Administration, playing key roles in regulatory matters, labor negotiations, contract disputes, property acquisitions and public relations issues. She is currently managing the third and final phase of the NBC's Combined Sewer Overflow Project, the largest public works project, and the most important clean water project in the history of RI.

Ms. Horridge holds a BS degree in Political Science from Providence College and a JD from Western New England University - School of Law. She is a member of the Rhode Island Bar Association and has been an elected member of its House of Delegates since 1991. Ms. Horridge is active in several clean water organizations besides National Association of Clean Water Agencies, including the New England Water Environment Association, Rhode Island Clean Water Association, Water Environmental Federation, American Water Works Association, and the Rhode Island CEO Council. OJ McFoy is a passionate public servant and water sector executive with over two decades of leadership in advancing innovative

strategies, delivering large scale multi-million-dollar comprehensive plans and capital projects, and expanding equitable public health policies. A native of Buffalo, NY, Mr. McFoy was educated in the Buffalo Public School system and is a 1993 graduate of Hutchinson Central Technical High School. He earned a BS in Civil Engineering from Clarkson University and a Certificate in Executive Management from the University at Buffalo. He is also a licensed Professional Engineer registered in the State of NY.

Since 2007, Mr. McFoy has served as Chairman of the Buffalo Water Board, championing regional water quality initiatives, and overseeing a recently negotiated \$75M 10-year public-private partnership to provide reliable and professional delivery of drinking water for the city. In his role, he has initiated major programs such as Replace Old Lead Lines (ROLL) to combat lead poisoning, and the City's Residential Affordable Water Program – focused on ensuring that water services are equitably delivered and are affordable for all residents.

Serving in several C-Suite roles at the Authority since 2006 and receiving appointment as Buffalo Sewer's General Manager in 2015, Mr. McFoy brings a commitment to diversifying the workforce and stimulating the local economy. He facilitated producing the City's National Award-winning Raincheck 2.0 Green Infrastructure Plan, that details nature-based solutions to the regional flooding and stormwater challenges due to climate change, while reimagining Buffalo's resiliency efforts through an equity lens.

Mr. McFoy serves on National, State, and Regional Boards dedicated to promoting the value of water and changing the culture of the water sector, including the US Water Alliance, Water Agency Leaders' Alliance, and New York Water and Environment Association. He is currently the President on the National Association of Clean Water Agencies' Board of Directors. In addition, he holds board positions locally with Buffalo Erie Niagara Land Improvement Corporation and the Buffalo Society of Natural Sciences, while being an active member of several organizations.



Kishia L. Powell *NACWA Board Member* General Manager and Chief Executive Officer WSSC Water Laurel, MD

Kishia Powell is a dynamic force in the global water sector with 25 years of experience in both the public and private sectors across the U.S. and London, England. Powell leads a team of 1,680 strong and manages the day-today operations of the largest water utility in Maryland – 8^{th} largest in the country – and ensures water and water

resource recovery services are safely provided to 1.9 million customers throughout a 1,000-square-mile service area.

Prior to being selected to lead WSSC Water, Ms. Powell served as DC Water's Chief Operating Officer and Executive Vice President. During her tenure at DC Water, she championed several initiatives, including a focus on operationalizing equity and environmental justice. She provided oversight for DC Water's 10-year \$6.4 billion capital improvement program and led the implementation of workstreams under the utility's strategic plan imperative for reliability.

Before DC Water, Ms. Powell was the City of Atlanta's Commissioner of Watershed Management, overseeing \$644 million in annual operating expenditures and a five-year capital improvement plan of \$1.26 billion. She previously served as the City of Jackson, MS Public Works Director and Bureau Head of Water and Wastewater for the City of Baltimore, where she was recognized by the Chesapeake Water Environment Association as a *Water Hero* in 2010. A licensed Professional Engineer in Maryland, Virginia, and the District of Columbia, she holds a BS in Civil Engineering from Morgan State University's Clarence M. Mitchell, Jr. School of Engineering.

Kevin Shafer serves as Executive Director of the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD). MMSD is a regional government agency that provides water reclamation and flood

management services for more than 1.1 million customers in 28 communities in the Greater Milwaukee Area. The District serves 411 square miles that cover all, or segments of, six watersheds. Established by state law, the District is governed by 11 commissioners with taxing authority. Since assuming this role, he has transformed the MMSD into one of the leading wastewater utilities in the country through the integration of green infrastructure with traditional infrastructure.

Mr. Shafer's 2035 Vision has propelled MMSD forward with climate change adaptation through an aggressive program to convert to renewable fuels, install green infrastructure, and preserve floodplains. His leadership has brought MMSD recognition as the recipient of almost every major award in the industry, including the *2012 US Water Prize*.

He currently serves on the boards of The Water Council and River Revitalization Foundation and is a past president of the National Association of Clean Water Agencies.
