David Chung is a partner in Crowell & Moring's Environment & Natural Resources Group. His practice focuses on litigation and regulatory counseling involving natural resources development and environmental issues. Mr. Chung has experience with matters concerning various environmental and public lands statutes, including the Clean Water Act (CWA), Clean Air Act, Endangered Species Act, National Environmental Policy Act, Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act, Federal Land Policy and Management Act, and National Forest Management Act.

Mr. Chung has represented clients in challenges to nationwide rulemakings, challenges to agency permitting decisions, and citizen suits at all levels of the judiciary. Most recently, he has filed briefs defending CWA permitting decisions in the Sixth Circuit and District of MT, as well as a Supreme Court amicus brief on behalf of a broad industry coalition in the County of Maui case (application of point source permitting requirements to releases of pollutants to groundwater).

In addition to serving as counsel to two large, multi-industry coalitions (Waters Advocacy Coalition and Agricultural Nutrient Policy Council), Mr. Chung currently counsels national trade associations serving electric utilities, agriculture, forestry, and mining on a wide range of CWA issues, including the scope of CWA jurisdiction, Corps nationwide 404 permits, EPA National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System general permits, effluent limitations guidelines, water quality standards, and total maximum daily loads. Mr. Chung has helped those associations develop comments on proposed regulatory actions and in advocacy meetings and discussions before federal agencies.

Mr. Chung received a JD from the George Washington University Law School and a BA from the University of Texas at Austin.

Devon Goodrich practices environmental and municipal law, working on a variety of issues relating to New York City's drinking water supply, wastewater collection and treatment systems, parks, and solid waste management.

From the beginning of Ms. Goodrich's career at the Law Department, her work has included counseling and litigation involving the City's wastewater management. She has counseled the City on Clean Water Act compliance, from meeting the requirements of the State Pollutant

Discharge Elimination System permits for the City's 14 wastewater treatment plants, which treat approximately 1.3 billion gallons of wastewater per day, to development and implementation of long-term control plans to reduce combined sewer discharges to New York City's water bodies.

She has also regularly counseled and litigated on behalf of the New York City Department of Environmental Protection to enforce the City's Watershed Regulations and protect the City's water supply system – which supplies approximately 1.1 billion gallons a day of high quality, affordable drinking water to over nine million people.

Ms. Goodrich received a JD from Harvard Law School and a BA with highest honors in English from Cornell University.
